These statistics include all students who had Journalism and Digital Communication (JDC) as a declared major at any time during the indicated Academic Year. For undergraduates, this represents both new and continuing students who are enrolled in the Mass Communications major with a Journalism and Media Studies concentration. For graduate students, the enrollments include both new and continuing students. The graduate level enrollments are broken out into two tracks: MJM (JMS M.A.) and MDJ (DJD M.A.). The headcounts for undergraduate and graduate level students are unduplicated within the indicated Academic Year. However, any student who went from the undergraduate program to the graduate program within the same academic year will be counted in both populations – once as an undergraduate and once as a graduate level student.
