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Approximately 33 million American adults had a movement disorder associated with medication use, ear infections, injury, or neurological disorders in 2008, with over 18 million people affected by neurological disorders worldwide. Current gait assessments used by physical therapists, such as the Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Walking Scale, provide only semi-quantitative data, and cannot assess walking quality in detail or describe how one's walking quality changes over time.
