

The following is additional information for the World Language major (French and Francophone Studies concentration):

French graduates are attractive to employers in numerous fields, in addition to graduate and professional schools. USF alumni in French may be found in such professions as education, business, foreign service, politics, law, and health.

It is possible to add a second World Languages concentration. Speak with a World Languages advisor to learn more.

All undergraduate students in any degree program can participate in undergraduate research. There are a number of options to receive academic credit for a mentored research experience and to have the experience show on t0.25 g0.ce t28icial transcript. Students who wish to enroll in an undergraduate research course should consult with their academic advisor to understand how the credit will apply towards the degree requirements.

Students must have at least a 2.0 GPA before graduation.

Students are recommended to continually gain relevant experience for their intended career and/or graduate school path. This might include becoming involved in volunteering ce research, completing an internship, ce being active on campus with an activity or organization relevant to future goals.
